


Welcome to the 2015 Autumn National Newsletter!

Adelaide

In February 2015, the Adelaide team kicked off their *Evangelistic Prayer Teams* for the year. Prayer for non-Christian colleagues is essential before reaching them with the gospel.

Adelaide has the most Evangelistic Prayer Teams of all the cities and has mobilised many Christian workers in city and suburban areas for this important task. These teams are a great place to equip and train Christian workers to reach their colleagues.

"Being a part of an Evangelistic Prayer Team reminds me of what's really important in my life. I get caught up in day-to-day work forgetting God is the Lord of my workplace and He wants me to serve him there. When I meet my Evangelistic Prayer Team, I see God's power working in our different workplaces. 

Brisbane

In March 2015, the Brisbane team started running equipping sessions called *Reaching Australia* in conjunction with Ann St Presbyterian Church in the CBD.

These sessions will continue during 2015 and are open to any church in Brisbane. It is hard work thinking about evangelising Australian adults. These sessions help Aussies think about how to reach their colleagues, friends and neighbours. The first training session was called 'I want to talk about Jesus but I just can't seem to get him or Christianity into the conversation. Help!'

"I really enjoyed Reaching Australia. I felt encouraged to develop lasting and genuine relationships with my non-Christian friends and family. It can be easy to feel that as a Christian I have to preach the entire bible in every conversation with a non-Christian but this workshop gave me the confidence to slow things down and to really listen to what my friends were saying."

Melbourne

In January 2015, the Melbourne team organised a week-long equipping event for Christian workers.

The *Lyceum* summer school mobilised Christian workers and equipped them with ways to engage apathetic, hostile and disinterested non-Christian colleagues. Training topics included:

- Sharing the Christian message with uninterested people
- Islam, ISIS & Terror
- A game plan for discussing your Christian convictions
- Should religion be excluded from the workplace?

Perth

In February - March 2015, the Perth team facilitated an equipping event called *Fruitfulness on the Frontline* over 8 lunchtime sessions.

This training course emphasised that being a follower of Christ is all about whole-life discipleship instead of a compartmented life. Each session was biblically-based and gave practical examples of how to be fruitful at work with the gospel. Training topics included: modelling godly character; ministering grace and love; moulding culture; and messenger of the gospel.

Sydney

In February - March 2015, the Sydney team hosted mobilising and equipping events for graduates and young workers.

Welcome to the Jungle mobilised graduates new to the workforce and equipped them with three tips to survive work this year: take care of yourself physically; glorify God in sharing and living out the gospel at work; and find a peer-to-peer network of Christians nearby.

Thriving in the Jungle mobilised those having worked for 3-5 years and equipped them with wisdom from the Bible. A panel of senior workers showed how their view of promotions, secondments and career changes was shaped by loving junior colleagues.

Headstart provides weekly teaching to young workers to prepare them for the everyday challenges (eg. how to deal with fatigue) and mission opportunities (eg. how to get to know "neighbours" in the office).

"When you start working in and travelling to the city, it's easy to wonder what you've got yourself into and whether it's worth it. Welcome to the Jungle was a great reminder that working in cities is not futile. God has placed his workers to win the city for Christ."
