Easter initiative - Adelaide

Evangelistic Prayer Team feeds a multitude with hot cross buns

On the day before Good Friday we offered free hot cross buns to everyone in our 1800 person building, copying a model used in Rhodes, Sydney. We advertised via posters on lunch room fridges, with management permission. Management made it clear we were not to preach but were welcome to introduce our group and invite anyone interested to speak with us afterwards. We had "Meaning of Easter" booklets discreetly available on a table and our "introduction" included a mention that Easter is a very important time to Christians and something we consider worth celebrating. The point was to get people thinking about the meaning of Easter and counter resistance to our prayer team from an anti-religious minority. City Bible Forum staff were run off their feet in a support role of toasting a few hundred hot cross buns while team members talked with colleagues. 200-270 staff turned up,



4 booklets were taken and we believe considerable goodwill was generated. We plan to repeat the event next year. Total cost was \$250 which was happily paid by EPT members!

Growing women's network - Brisbane

There is a real need in the city for Christians to be supported and encouraged. The work place is not only full of pressures but can be a place of great isolation. In God's kindness our breakfasts for Christian women and the growing number of women's prayer teams have been answering this need in the city.





It has been a real partnership with many Christian women working with our new colleague Gemma to grow these ministries. Please pray for women in the city of Brisbane. Pray that the Christians will be salt and light. Pray that God might save many who are lost.

Partnership with a capital P - Sydney

Christian consortium stages mega Easter event in Barangaroo, Sydney

Recently 11 Christian groups from major companies partnered with City Bible Forum and Scots Church Margaret Street to organise a mega Easter outreach event. The event was held in the heart of the new Barangaroo precinct in the offices of Lend Lease. 160 people attended including at least 40 non-Christian guests. This follows a successful Christmas event.

Sam Chan's evangelism training was appreciated by over 80 Canberrans who participated in at least one of two half day sessions titled: "How to tell your friends about Jesus" & "Getting mission back on the agenda at church".

Many commented on how helpful Sam's approach is for connecting with the important issues of non-believers and sharing the wisdom and salvation of Christ. It was a joy to offer this training in partnership with Canberra Christian Conventions and to see participants from so many churches across Canberra!

This was also an ideal opportunity for key Christians to be introduced to Sam and begin thinking how to encourage others to get behind the week long cross-city mission in June: *alt-Jesus? The Jesus you never knew.*

In the lead up to the mission we are working on extending the evangelistic prayer network and Sam is SMSing weekly tips & encouragements.

Bigger Questions - Melbourne

City Bible Forum to reach 44,000 people each week in Melbourne

Our radio show Logos Live has been sharpened, renamed and re-branded as Bigger Questions. We are really excited with the new show as a tool for evangelism to the postmodern world.

We are particularly excited that the show is now broadcast at 9 p.m. on 89.9 Light FM – Australia's largest community radio station. Light FM reaches over 1 million people monthly and an estimated 44,000 people will be tuning in on Sunday evenings when the show is broadcast. We are really excited about the greater exposure and greater number of people who will listen to the show. We pray that many who aren't believers will be struck by the stories and the Scripture and will follow Jesus.

We are also pleased that the live recordings at lunchtime in the CBD so far in 2017 have had stronger attendances. We have a good venue right in the heart of the city and Christian workers find it a great forum to invite colleagues - about 10% of the audience are not Christian. In fact one worker came to a live show, went back to his office and bumped into a colleague. She asked him what he'd been to and she thought it sounded interesting, and came along with him next time! Pray that more city workers invite their colleagues to explore the bigger questions with us.
